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# Overview

This City & Guilds accredited Knitting course is perfect for knitters with a little more experience.

This course consists of 12 modules which focus on getting students to develop their own style and designs, while giving students valuable professional practice.

Our accredited courses are unique to the School of Stitched Textiles. They are comprehensive textile educational programmes that aim to not only teach essential techniques, but also enhance creativity and design skills.



# **Course Delivery**

This course is supplied as a distance learning course where course materials and tutor assessments are delivered digitally and work is returned to your tutor via digital presentation.

You will work through written and illustrated course materials which are supplemented with 'how to' videos and online galleries.

Your coursework will be reviewed by your tutor and periodically by an Internal Quality Assessor. You will be provided with written feedback and, if needed, you will be able to re-submit altered work.

You can contact your tutor at any time to request your work to date be reviewed and suggestions for future progress be made.



# MODULE 1: INTRODUCTION TO THE THE BASICS

## MODULE 2: DEVELOPING A PORTFOLIO

This unit is all about developing your own designs. You'll be given the chance to really experiment with different ideas and image while using different principles of line, colour and texture.

### Chain Cast Off

A simple knit stitch cast off is used frequently.

Knit two stitches, then with the left needle, lift the first stitch over the second. Knit the next stitch. Repeat until one stitch remains. Break the yarn, take the end through the remaining stitch and tighten.

To cast off in pattern, simply work knit or purl stitches along the cast off row as they would normally occur in the stitch pattern.








### Checking your tension

It is vital to check your tension before starting any project. Tension is the number of stitches and rows to a cm or inch and determines the size of whatever you are knitting. The size of stitch depends on the yarn, size of knitting needles and your control of the yarn. You can check your tension by knitting a tension square at least 13cm (5.5") and placing a ruler vertically. Mark 10cm (4") with pins and count the number of stitches and rows and check this complies with your pattern's requirements.





### **MODULE 3: ADVANCED STITCHES**

In this module you'll learn more advanced stitch techniques.

- Increase and decrease stitches
- Lace stitch
- Cable stitch
- Bobble samples.

This module also includes a study of different wool and cotton fibres to create different textures

### **MODULE 4: ADVANCED TECHNIQUES**

- Knitting on round needles
- Knitting on four needles
- Creating stripes
- Developing colour combinations
- Creating pockets
- Buttonholes

# MODULE 5: DEVELOPING DIFFERENT STYLES

In this module you will study different approaches to knitting, such as:

- Open work
- Fair isle technique; working with multiple colours & advanced patterns
- Intarsia stitch
- Knitting with beads, and how to incorporate them into designs
- Study the properties of manmade yarns and fibres.

### **MODULE 6: COLOUR**

This module focuses on creating your own coloured yarn and fabrics. More specifically you will explore:

• How to colour fibres & fabrics

• Create your own designer folio.

### **MODULE 7: FINISHES**

This module focuses on professional finishing techniques, including:

- Samples of buttons
- Braids
- Cords
- Tassels
- Decorative edging and finishing techniques.

# MODULE 8: EXPERIEMENTAL SAMPLES

- Experiment with different samples and develop ideas
- Design and create your first final piece.

### **MODULE 9: SECOND FINAL PIECE**

Design and create your second final piece.



### **MODULE 10: FINAL PIECE**

Design and create your third & final piece.

### **MODULE 11: PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE**

- Produce a professional CV and profile
- How to price the items that you will go on to produce
- Compile a business plan and assess the competition
- How to present work for promotional purposes online.

### **MODULE 12: PRESENTATION**


Full presentation compiled of all work for submission.



This is a great way of allowing students to really feel like they are part of a group where they are able to express any concerns and share their creative progress. We also hold regular 'live chat' sessions with tutors.









