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Overview

This City & Guilds accredited Machine Embroidery course is perfect for students with a little more experience.

This course consists of 12 modules which focus on getting students to develop their own style and designs, while giving students valuable professional practice.

Our accredited courses are unique to the School of Stitched Textiles. They are comprehensive textile educational programmes that aim to not only teach essential techniques, but also enhance creativity and design skills.



Course Delivery

This course is supplied as a distance learning course where course materials and tutor assessments are delivered digitally and work is returned to your tutor via digital presentation.

You will work through written and illustrated course materials which are supplemented with 'how to' videos and online galleries. Your coursework will be reviewed by your tutor and periodically by an Internal Quality Assessor. You will be provided with written feedback and, if needed, you will be able to re-submit altered work.

You can contact your tutor at any time to request your work to date be reviewed and suggestions for future progress be made.



MODULE 1: THE BASICS

- Research of a chosen artist. You'll get the opportunity to explore an artist (across all mediums), to help you develop your own interest area and personal style
- Introduction into machine Embroidery basic stitches
- Straight stitching
- Free
- Swing needle samples
- Presentation methods.

MODULE 2: DEVELOPING A PORTFOLIO

This unit is all about developing your own designs. You'll be given the chance to really experiment with different ideas and image while using different principles of line, colour and texture.



In this exercise you will investigate swing needle stitching, more commonly known as zig-zag stitch, on your machine as well as stitching fabrics in layers. You are still going to use your machine on a normal dressmaking setting, i.e. with the feed dog up and the presser foot on.

You'll need 3 layers of fabric the same sizes. This sample can work really well with a geometric print as it gives you something to follow, so that will form the top layer. You'll also need something with a slightly thicker pile such as felt or fleece in the middle and a normal plain calico or medium weight furnishing fabric

Follow the steps below to produce your sample;

- · Place your fabrics together like a sandwich (see fig 1 on the next page).
- edges and across the fabric.
- · Working within the area of your A4 sample size, and using machine straight stitch again, draw across the fabric in the form of a zig-zag line, a key pattern, linked squares or something similarly geometric.
- Add some more rows underneath this one. which repeat the shapes, or echo them, or link up with them in some way. Keep going until you have filled your area
- There are some possible arrangements of shapes on the next page in fig 2.

Now, increase your stitch width so it becomes a zig-zag and either go over some of your straight stitching lines or stitch extra ones If you are going round corners, think about the shapes of your stitches and how they overlap.

MODULE 3: ADVANCED STITCHES

In this module you'll learn more advanced stitch techniques.

- Basic and Reverse applique
- Couching
- WhipMoss
- Cable and feather stitch samples.

MODULE 4: ADVANCED TECHNIQUES

- Using different machine feet
- Decorative Stitches
- Creating Eyelets
- Buttonholes
- Free machine quilting.









MODULE 5: DEVELOPING DIFFERENT STYLES

Here you will study a range of different methods to produce depth and texture:

- Disolvable fabric/film
- Layering and Bonding
- Transparent and Tucked
- Distressing
- Insertion.

MODULE 6: COLOUR

This module focuses on creating your own coloured yarn and fabrics. More specifically you will explore:

- How to colour fibres and fabrics
- Create your own designer folio.





MODULE 7: FINISHES

In this module you will:

- Explore the different decorative finishes and how to include them to compliment your designs
- Explore the different edges to achieve a professional looking product or art piece.

MODULE 8: EXPERIEMENTAL SAMPLES

- Experiment with different samples and develop ideas
- Design and create your first final piece.

MODULE 9: SECOND FINAL PIECE

• Design and create your second final piece.



MODULE 10: FINAL PIECE

Design and create your third & final piece.

MODULE 11: PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

- Produce a professional CV and profile
- How to price the items that you will go on to produce
- Compile a business plan and assess the competition
- How to present work for promotional purposes online.

MODULE 12: PRESENTATION

Full presentation compiled of all work for submission.


